

The Perfect Playoff Plan

Home Game Scheduling Rules

The Perfect Playoff Plan is built on the [SAFE Philosophy](#) of Students and Academics first with Fair and Equal treatment for all Teams & Conferences. That means [No Patsy](#) opponents and [No Cupcake](#) status for any Team or Conference resulting in a reduction to an 11 game Regular Season Schedule over 12 weeks. The result is a reduction in Home Games by 1 or 2 for most Teams to achieve a maximum of 6 home games for the 45 Group 1 teams.

The 45 Group 1 teams will play their 6 home games as 4 Home Conference games and 2 Home and Away Non-Conference series against Group 1 & 2 teams and their 3rd Non-Conference game at Home against a Group 2 or 3 team.

During the 2017 Regular Season, 40 of the 90 teams included in the Major College Football Division played 7 or 8 home games. Under the maximum 6 home game rule of the Perfect Playoff Plan, 68 teams will lose 1 or 2 home games. The benefits of not playing a 12th Regular Season game against an FCS Patsy team or a weak Cupcake team out-weigh the 1 or 2 fewer home games.

The Perfect Playoff Plan's [Major College Football Division \(MCFD\)](#) with 90 teams is designed to make every Regular Season game count towards winning a place in the [16 Team National Championship Playoff Series \(NCPS\)](#). So the rule that every team will play 4 Conference home and away games each season is necessary to insure that every team has the same chance to win the Championship. No polls, computers nor committees allowed, because they caused the [College Football Playoff to Fail](#). Likewise making Conferences equal in status, size and strength is the reason that winning the Conference Championship is the only achievement required to get into the Playoff. Having a 16 Team playoff gives 6 second place teams that second chance to get into the Playoff. All 10 Second Place teams have an Equal chance to win one of the final 6 spots by simply winning more games than 4 of the others.

The Home Game Schedule Rules are an important Equalizing factor in making the 16 team Perfect Playoff Plan successful at determining an [Undisputed National Championship](#) for the Major College Football Division.
