## The 10 former FCS Patsy Teams

The 2017 Regular Season of the NCAA Division 1 FBS featured 130 teams with unequal status in 10 Conferences of unequal status, size and strength of programs. The [Perfect Playoff Plan 16](#) will correct this inequality by reorganizing the FBS into a new football only [Major College Football Division \(MCFD\)](#) with the 90 strongest teams in 10 Conferences with Equal Status, Size and Strength of Programs.

This requires a consolidation that drops the weakest 40 teams. First dropping these 10 former FCS teams added since 2012 because of the [No Patsy Rule](#), and then the [30 Cupcakes](#) (\*) with the weakest records.

The former **FCS Patsy Teams** have not been able to compete in the FBS, especially against the Power 5 Conference teams. Their 2017 total combined record against Power 5 Teams was 1 - 14 and against the 90 teams for the [Major College Football Division](#) was only 6 - 29 (.171 win percentage).

(\*) **CCU (Coastal Carolina)** is in transition from the FCS to the Sun Belt Conference in 2017 with full membership in 2018 to then make the final FBS count 129 teams after 2017.
